- **Assistant Coaches & Advisors** must participate in the OHSET Coaches training before they can register for their **SECOND** season of coaching/advising..
- **Coaches in their first years** must participate in the OHSET Coaches training no less than once every two seasons;; every season is highly recommended.
- Once a coach or advisor **has participated in OHSET Coaches training in two different seasons**, they are required to only attend once every 5 years thereafter.
